- 3. Elevate and support families as educational partners, leaders, and advocates who nurture and foster the long-term success of children.
- 4. Attract, develop, and retain top talent in the field of early childhood education.
- 5. Leverage Pre-K 4 SA's position as a national leader and expert in high-quality early learning and care to advance early childhood policy, research, and innovation.







EDUCATION CENTERS

Demonstrating What Is Possible

- 2,000 children each year (3 & 4-year-olds)
- Meets highest national standards:
 - Certified teachers with specialized training
 - Evidenced-based curriculum
 - Play-based learning
- Extended hours for working families
- Free transportation







EDUCATION CENTERS

Innovating to Address Challenges









PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Improving Instruction Birth-3rd Grade

- 20,000+ hours annually—free to participants
- Specialists work in public, private, faith-based schools and centers across the city,
- Providing initial certification (CDA) to 40 educators a year







GRANTS

Increasing Quality and Access

- \$4 Million awarded annually
- Supporting over 4,000 additional children annually
- Awards available to public, private, charter, faith-based programs
- Shared Services to support child development centers as small businesses







FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Developing Families as Leaders and Advocates

- Over 10,000 family interactions each year
- Services based on family interests and needs
- Connecting families to workforce and post-secondary education
- Families learning from each other

Governance Structure & Finances

GOVERNANCE

- CEO dual reporting relationship
 - City Manager and Board of Directors
- Eleven-Member Board of Directors
 - Appointed by Mayor and City Council
 - Represents business and education community
 - "More Than Advisory"
 - Adopts rules to govern, accepts grants or loans, employs necessary personnel
 - Meets monthly



SALES TAX FUNDING

- 1/8 cent sales tax approved by the Citizens of San Antonio in November 2012
- Collected by the State and remitted to the Corporation monthly
- Authorization to collect through March 31, 2029 (reauthorized in November 2020)







State Sales Tax 6.25%

City 1.25%

Transit .75%

Pre-K 4 SA receives 10% of the total City Sales Tax




FUNDING MECHANISMS

- Fully self-supported by dedicated revenues
 - Does not receive any General Fund dollars
 - Funded primarily by voter approved 1/8¢ sales tax
 - Additional funding = State match, tuition, USDA Grant

FY 2022 Adopted Revenue


Sales Tax 83%
